




## The Old Covenant Defined Exodus 19:3-8, 21-25 Exodus 24:3, 7 "All that the LORD has said we will do..."

## Did the people keep their promise? No This is why Moses threw the tablets down and broke them


# The Ten Commandments are the covenant Deuteronomy 4:11-13



The Law: No longer outwardly imposed Inwardly inscribed But it remains a part of the human experience nonetheless

So the law doesn't go away. The covenant doesn't end. What changes is the onus of who is making sure that the people keep it. God is now promising to empower them to keep it, instead of them promising to keep it in their own strength

Also, we assume when we don't keep the law that we are cast off and can't be God's people anymore. But part of the new covenant, given to law breakers, is that they will be brought into God's favor, through God's pursuit of them. "They will be my people, and I will be their God" "Their sins and their lawless deeds I will remember no more



If God has no intention of remembering your sins, why is it that we insist on reminding ourselves of our sins?

## Better covenant, better promises Hebrews 8:6-13

No longer is the covenant based upon man's faulty promises to God, it's now based upon God's faithful promises to man

Through the hands of a mediator

So it's not the terms of the covenant at fault, it's the self confidence, and self righteousness of the people who made the agreement

What is justification by faith? It is the work of God in laying the glory of man in the dust, and doing for man that which it is not in his power to do for himself. When men see their own nothingness, they are prepared to be clothed with the righteousness of Christ. FLB 111.2


In Exodus 19 and 24 the Israelites clearly did not recognize their nothingness, and in turn were not in a place to receive the righteousness of Christ



The unbelieving world will know that God is LORD alone when there is a people that looks like Jesus.


This is what they have been looking for all along.


The Israelites weren't better than everyone else, they were the missionaries who were to represent Christ to the world.

He wanted it to be the essence of who we are Because it's the essence of Who He is








We have the Romans 7 quandary

God would do that for me? I'm dirty I have idols I have a stony heart I don't obey









I will cease trying to appease God by my deeds

I will yield my will, my power of choice, my desires to the One Who has given all for me and desires my happiness






Yielding our wills, and choosing to receive Christ's spirit of surrender is the hardest thing we will ever do

"Thus, obedience is not our achievement or performance, but a **consequence** of letting God work in us. Alone, we are not able to follow Him."


"Power to overcome evil and live in harmony with His commandments comes from a source outside of us."

"Only the Spirit of God can transform hearts and enable people to observe His laws and instructions.


What God requires He also provides."








## Romans 8:3-8
