3. MAINTAINING YOUR GARDEN

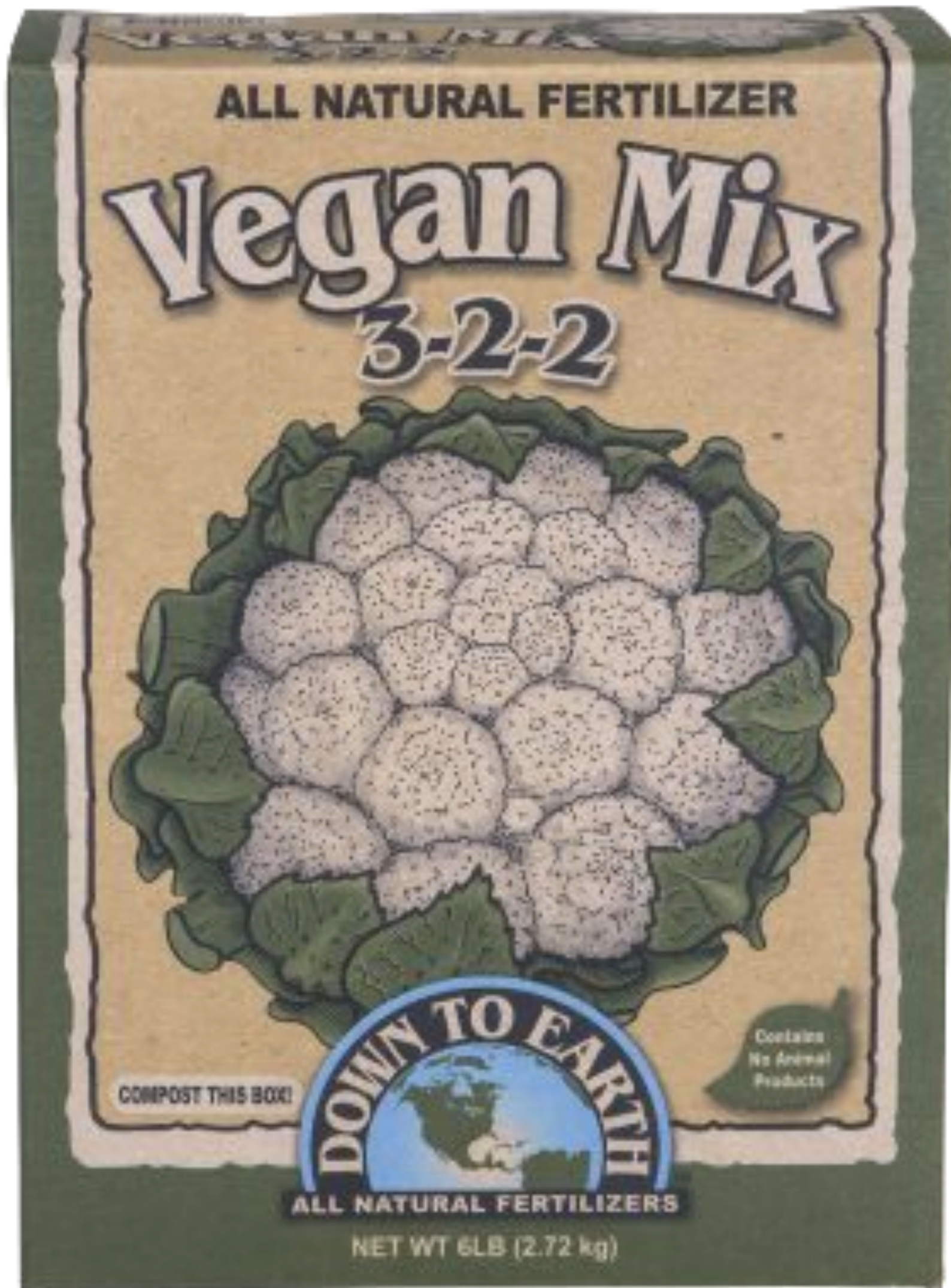


GARDEN MAINTENANCE

 - Easy for plants to get water stress
 - Mulching to slow evaporation
 - Self-watering planters

- Fertilizing
