

## CASE STUDY: KING JEHOSHAPHAT

- 1) Worked to obliterate idol worship in his kingdom (1 Chronicles 17:3-4)
- 2) Established systematic instruction of the Holy Scriptures in his realm (II Chronicles 17:7-10)
  "To this wise provision for the spiritual needs of his subjects, Jehoshaphat owed
  - much of his prosperity as a ruler." PP 191
- 3) Set up judges throughout his kingdom, with a court of appeals (II Chronicles 19:5-11)
- 4) Made Judah an economic powerhouse (II Chronicles 17:5, 18:1)
- 5) Built fortresses and storage cities, and vigorously trained his armies for war (II Chronicles 17:12-19)


## CASE STUDY: KING JEHOSHAPHAT

"Jehoshaphat was a man of courage and valor. For years he had been strengthening his armies and his fortified cities. He was well prepared to meet almost any foe; yet in this crisis he put not his trust in the arm of flesh. **Not by disciplined armies and fenced cities, but by a living faith in the God of Israel, could he hope to gain the victory** of these heathen who boasted of their power to humble Judah in the eyes of the nations." (PK 198)

"Then the realm of Jehoshaphat was quiet, for his God gave him rest all around." (II Chronicles 20:30)

## CASE STUDY: JOSHUA


"Joshua had received the promise that God would surely overthrow these enemies of Israel, yet **he put forth as earnest effort as though success depended upon the armies of Israel alone**. He did all that human energy could do, and then he cried in faith for divine aid. **The secret of success is the union of divine power with human effort.** Those who achieve the greatest results are those who rely most implicitly upon the Almighty Arm." 

- 3) COMBINE TO PROPERLY FRAME A DECISION AND PROVIDE INTELLIGENT COUNSEL



## **NEHEMIAH**

"Now it happened when Sanballat, Tobiah, and Geshem the Arab, and the rest of our enemies heard that I had rebuilt the wall, and that there were no breaks left in it (though at that time I had not hung the doors in the gates), that Sanballat and Geshem sent to me, saying, "Come, let us meet together among the villages in the plain of Ono." But they thought to do me harm." (Nehemiah 6:1-2)

## TIPS ON BALANCING THE LOAD



## CASE STUDY: JESUS IN DIALOGUE

Nicodemus: "Rabbi, we know that You are a teacher come from God; for no one can do these signs that You do unless God is with him." (John 3:1)

"His words were designed to express and to invite confidence; but they really expressed unbelief." (DA 168)

"Instead of recognizing this salutation, . . . He came directly to the point . . . (DA 168)

Jesus: "Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God." (John 3:2)

## CASE STUDY: JESUS IN DIALOGUE

Disciples: "Therefore, when they had come together, they asked Him, saying, "Lord, will You at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?" (Acts 1:6)

Jesus doesn't confirm or deny. He absorbs and redirects.

Jesus: "It is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has put in His own authority. But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." (Acts 1:7-8)
