

8. Faith is contagious! It encourages believers and church members in that part of the world to do the same thing!

Every clinic started with prayer... ...that God would use us as tools in His hands that the people would see the love of God through us...



He said he was given a book on salvation, but he said, "We have seen salvation today in these people...these people are specialists in their field, but every one of us is a specialist in our own field...we should be using our talents to serve others like these people who have served us today!" (Praise God! He got it!!!!)

There is no question that strictly humanitarian aid is greatly needed all over the world...even here in the United States!

But true complete health involves more than **physical** wellbeing.

It involves **emotional** well-being, AND **spiritual** well-being!

Many times organizations go on humanitarian aid trips, but they neglect the emotional and especially **the spiritual** aspects of health. Going on a medical MISSION trips involves all three aspects of health!

The work of God in this earth can never be finished until the men and women comprising our church membership rally to the work and unite their efforts with those of ministers and church officers.

The salvation of sinners requires earnest, personal labor. We are to bear to them the word of life, not to wait for them to come to us. Oh, that I could speak words to men and women that would arouse them to diligent action! The moments now granted to us are few. We are standing upon the very borders of the eternal world. We have no time to lose. Every moment is golden and altogether too precious to be devoted merely to self-serving. Who will seek God earnestly and from Him draw strength and grace to be His faithful workers in the missionary field? 9T 117.1

A spirit of gratitude improves not only mental health, but physical health...remember Joy vs. Resentment study...

"Medical missionary work brings to humanity the gospel of release from suffering. It is the pioneer work of the gospel. It is the gospel practiced, the compassion of Christ revealed. Of this work there is great need, and the world is open for it. God grant that the importance of medical missionary work shall be understood, and that new fields may be immediately entered." Medical Ministry, 239

"...The mission of Christ was to heal the sick, encourage the hopeless, bind up the **brokenhearted**. This work of restoration is to be carried on among the needy, suffering ones of humanity. God calls not only for your benevolence, but your cheerful countenance, your hopeful words, the grasp of your hand. Relieve some of God's afflicted ones. **Some are sick**, **and hope has departed**. **Bring back the sunlight to them**. There are souls who have lost their courage; speak to them, pray for them. There are those who need the bread of life. Read to them from the Word of God. **There is a soul sickness no balm can reach**, **no medicine heal**. Pray for these, and **bring them to Jesus Christ**. And in all your work, Christ will be present to make impressions upon human hearts.








<u>How to structure a short-term overseas medical</u> missionary clinic.

It is very helpful if you team up with organizations who have done it before and have contacts in that country.

Examples are:

It Is Written, Maranatha, Quiet Hour and many more

A MUST! Is to have local contacts and an organization that **you can trust** to make the necessary arrangements for you.

- -- where it is safe to stay
- -- which churches or community centers you will be located
- -- provide necessary transportation, food arrangements, etc.


Examples of how we structured a vision clinic in various countries:

Costa Rica – 2 eye doctors Peru – 1 eye doctor, 2 family practice physicians Mongolia – 120 volunteers...multi-disciplinary team of psychiatry, physcial therapy, OBGYN, primary care, general surgeons, vascular surgeons, a retinal specialist, a cataract surgeon, an optometrist, an optician, a pharmacist, dentists, oral surgeons Moldova – 1 eye doctor

2 exam lanes with 2 interpreters!










This 63 year old man's vision was 20/800!

The value of a vision clinic to break down barriers in overseas medical missionary work.

Largest needs anywhere in the world:

#1 – almost always **dental** needs#2 – usually **vision** needs

usually lack of quality access & cost...

The value of a vision clinic to break down barriers in overseas medical missionary work.

Dental – can give **long-term benefit** of pain relief & better smiles

Vision – can give them something they may be able to use long-term (possibly for years) and even share with other family members (especially reading glasses)

The value of a vision clinic to break down barriers in overseas medical missionary work.

"As a means of **overcoming prejudice** and gaining access to minds, medical missionary work must be done, not in one or two places only, but in many places where the truth has not yet been proclaimed. We are to work as gospel medical missionaries, to heal the sin-sick souls by giving them the message of salvation. **This work will break down prejudice as nothing else can.**"

—Testimonies for the Church 9:211

(Example of two Moldovan men that wouldn't step foot into the church because they were superstitious...)

At the end of the clinic...after seeing 153 patients and having to turn probably another 50 away, the pastor asked us if we could just see 2 more men...they had invited these men to their church many times, but because the men were superstitious they would never step foot inside the church. The pastor said it would be a disgrace to turn them away today, so we saw them.

That's the power of medical missionary work to break down barriers of prejudice so we can demonstrate the love of God!!!!





