

From the story of Daniel's deliverance we may learn that in seasons of trial and gloom God's children should be just what they were when their prospects were bright with hope and their surroundings all that they could desire. Daniel in the lions' den was the same Daniel who stood before the king as chief among the ministers of state and as a prophet of the Most High. A man whose heart is stayed upon God will be the same in the hour of his greatest trial as he is in prosperity, when the light and favor of God and of man beam upon him. Faith reaches to the unseen, and grasps eternal realities.

It's easy to find oneself in a mindset of fear when thinking about having to face a circumstance like this. There's not way I could stand like them. And we can be tempted to believe that these guys, seemingly on a whim, mustered the guts to be these superhuman giants of faith.

Only by faithfulness in the little things can the soul be trained to act with fidelity under larger responsibilities. God brought Daniel and his fellows into connection with the great men of Babylon, that these heathen men might become acquainted with the principles of true religion. In the midst of a nation of idolaters, Daniel was to represent the character of God.

This is just how incredibly mission minded God is. Even when He's disciplining His people for their sins He still usies the faithful among them like trojan horses to reach the heathens who have taken them captive and to reveal the true God to them. God's rod of correction sends them away to reach people they refused to try to reach when they were in prosperity.

Another thing that is clear in His dealings with His people is that He's not a racist or showing undue favor to Israel. Their call was a missional one. To show the rest of the world that you can be saved too. But they were selfish, and rebellious and when they messed up they got a whoopin' and got exiled too. Just like the nations they disposed from their land. And in the midst of that whoopin' I'll use some of you to reach these people while you're there.

How did he become fitted for a position of so great trust and honor? It was his faithfulness in the little things that gave complexion to his whole life. He honored God in the smallest duties, and the Lord co-operated with him. To Daniel and his companions God gave "knowledge and skill in all learning and wisdom; and Daniel had understanding in all visions and dreams." Daniel 1:17.





"As the will of man cooperates with the will of God, it becomes omnipotent. Whatever is to be done at His command may be accomplished in His strength. All His biddings are enablings."



Our Hope Of Being Able To Stand

- They didn't all of the sudden muster some magical faith
- They did as they had always done when face to face with a decision to make. They stood for Jesus

Our Hope Of Being Able To Stand

- The way that you and I can stand then is by giving God our decision today
- The decision I make today will make me into the person I will be then
- When I do that today I'm preparing for my faithfulness then

This Should Humble And Encourage Us

- **First, because God seems to place a higher value on my day to day decisions than I do**
- **Second, because God seems to have more faith in my ability to stand at the end of time than I do**
- **We wouldn't be living at that time if God didn't believe that we could**

This Should Humble And Encourage Us

- The same practical lessons can be applied to our character development
- Jesus, day by day is making you into someone you couldn't become apart from Christ
- Many people are freaked out about the idea of perfection

This Should Humble And Encourage Us

- If we yield our day to day decisions to God we don't have to be afraid anymore
- You can stand for Jesus on the plain of Dura when everyone else bows
- Because you gave Him yesterday's decisions, and the day before that, etc. You're developing a lifestyle, a habit, a train of thought that continually seeks power from God

This Should Humble And Encourage Us

- You'll be able to tell the popes and the prelates "but if not"
- This is what God wants for you
- He doesn't want you to fail, He's not setting you up to fail


This Should Humble And Encourage Us

- **The time without a Mediator. What is a Mediator?**
- **What will you do when you don't have a Mediator? The same thing you did the day before.**
- **A time will come when you won't need someone to transfer sin into the sanctuary on your behalf.**

- **I knew after this that God would indeed speak to His people and they will know when to leave and what to do. How? What we talked about Wednesday night. Learning how to hear the voice of God for ourselves through communion with Him. You won't argue with Him even if it sounds crazy, and you will go where He leads.**

 - This is the hardest thing for God to do. To turn us over to our decisions.


- **The power of choice matters. Satan understands this, and this is why he tempts us to place such a low estimate on our day to day decisions.**

- **He's seeking a relationship. That's His end goal. A relationship that is fireproof.**




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
