Fight or Flight?

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The "fight or flight response" is the response of the body to a perceived threat. When faced with danger, the body releases hormones such as adrenaline and cortisol. These hormones give us a burst of energy and strength by increasing the heart rate, slowing digestion and directing blood to major muscle groups.





Although the response is helpful in cases of physical threat (such as needing to run away from a bear), it is inappropriate and maladaptive when it occurs in social or performance situations, as is the case with social anxiety disorder (SAD).







In Ephesians 6 we see how God wants to prepare us for those times of perceived threat.



- Waist with truth (Defensive)

- Shield of faith (Defensive)
- Helmet of salvation (Defensive)
- Sword of the Spirit (Offensive)

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The Armor Of God Ephesians 6:14-17

Breastplate of righteousness (Defensive)

• Feet with Gospel of peace (Defensive)

If we don't learn how to use this one offensive item to defend ourselves, we're going to spend our entire Christian experience running from the enemy, instead of standing as Paul commands us in the text, just trying to survive.





Hence the title for this evening's message Fight or Flight?





Some of us may feel like that's our experience today.

I find that interesting when thinking about our next text. Turn to 1 Samuel 17







David hear's Goliath blaspheming God and offers to fight him. Saul tries to talk him off the ledge, but David won't back down.

Saul's mindset: youth=inexperience/weakness






1 Samuel 17:34-39

David didn't know how to use a sword, but he did know how to call on the Lord in his time of need.



1 Samuel 17:40-49





So David prevailed over the Philistine with a sling and with a stone, and struck the Philistine and killed him. There was no sword in the hand of David. -1 Samuel 17:50





Then David ran and stood over the Philistine and took his sword and drew it out of its sheath and killed him and cut off his head with it. When the Philistines saw that their champion was dead, they fled. -1 Samuel 17:51





David chose fight. The Philistines chose flight.







From this point forward David always used a sword in battle because he now had experience with one.





"Saul has struck down his thousands, and David his ten thousands." -1 Samuel 18:7





God intends for His people to be well equipped to use the Sword of the Spirit, not only to defend themselves, but to advance His Kingdom.



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But what do you do when you have a whole group of people (army) without swords?





1 Samuel 13:19-21



There were no blacksmiths to sharpen the swords of God's people because their enemies knew that if they were properly equipped they would succeed in battle. Isn't that just the way satan works?

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We have to prioritize equipping our young people for battle. How can we expect them to fight for the kingdom if they can't even survive their own daily battles because of a lack of training in, or a knowledge of, the Word of God?

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"My people are destroyed for lack of knowledge..." -Hosea 4:6



This is why we are beginning the CORE program. To deal with this very issue. To train young people to be able to succeed in their own battles, and to be able to fight for the kingdom in what ever arena God calls them.

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There is no line of work in which it is possible for the youth to receive greater benefit. All who engage in ministry are God's helping hand. They are co-workers with the angels; rather, they are the human agencies through whom the angels accomplish their mission. Angels speak through their voices, and work by their hands. And the human workers, co-operating with heavenly agencies, have the benefit of their education and experience. As a means of education, what "university course" can equal this?

So on the day of the battle there was neither sword nor spear found in the hand of any of the people with Saul and Jonathan, but Saul and Jonathan his son had them.

-1 Samuel 13:22





This is what too many of our churches look like today. The pastor/bible worker are out on the front lines, while the members don't have what they need to engage in this fight. That has to change.





Remember Paul said we need to put on the WHOLE armor of God or we won't be able to withstand the attacks of the devil.



If you were in this army, an army that's unarmed, and you were facing a huge opposing army that did have swords, how would you be feelling? I would choose flight. Many did just that. 1 Samuel 14:11,22



Maybe you're a young person who feels like you're the only person in your class who is willing to fight God's battles, and you don't think you can make any difference by yourself. Take a look at what God can do through someone in a situation just like yours.





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1 Samuel 14:1-23



Jonathan chose fight. The Philistines chose flight.





When Jonathan took that step of faith and went alone if no one else would join him, God fought for him. And when others saw what God did, and how He provided, they decided to join in the fight. Your example can make a huge difference. Don't give up.





Fighting the battles without help can be a very lonely experience. Especially in settings like this. But God stands with you, and every ounce of comfort, strength, and integrity that you need for each day He is more than willing to provide. You're not alone.





"I believe no man can be completely able to summon all his strength, all his will, all his energy, for the last desperate move, till he is convinced that the last bridge is down behind him and that there is nowhere to go, but on." -The White Spider Page 90





I'm fully convinced that we find ourselves in that "last desperate move" that the author is referring to. In his case it was referring to climbing mountains, in ours is the closing scenes of this great conflict between Christ and satan. We need to be training Jonathan's to finish this work.

Would you want to find yourself in a situation like David? Standing before a giant without knowing how to use a sword? If David lost, God's people lost. Everything was on the line.



Yes God fought for him in that situation, because he called out to Him and God used what he had in his hand. But David never went to battle without one after this.





There's only one other instance where David is without a sword after his battle with Goliath, but he quickly finds one to be able to ensure he can defend himself.





1 Samuel 21:8, 9





Whose sword is he given when he is in need? The first sword he had experience with. The sword of Goliath





Are we beginning to see the need we have as a people to gain a knowledge of, and an experience with the Sword of the Spirit?





"For you shall not go out with haste, Nor go by flight; For the Lord will go before you, And the God of Israel will be your rear guard." -lsaiah 52:12





That means that victory is assured behind you (the cross) And before you (the second coming)





We have two choices on this battlefield: Fight, like David and Jonathan Flight, like the Philistines and the Israelites Which choice will you make?



"Look up, my brethren. Has the gospel lost its power to impress hearts? Is it because the regenerating influence of the Spirit of Christ has died away that hearts are not purified, sanctified, and prepared for the Holy Spirit? No; the Sword of the Spirit, the Word of the living God, is with us yet; but it must be wielded with earnestness. Let us use it as did God's sanctified ones of old. By its living, quickening power it will cut its way to hearts...



The Lord calls for a reformation all through our ranks.... When the church is awakened [*and trained], decided changes will be made. Men and women will be converted, and so filled will they be by the Spirit of God that they will pass from country to country, from city to city, proclaiming the message of truth.
