Chicks

• Pros

- 1. You know the background and health of your hen.

Chicks

• Cons

- 1. Time consuming
- 2. Lots of extra supplies that don't need for grown birds
- 3. You inevitably will loose a percentage of the chicks in the first few weeks



Ready to Lay Hens

• Pros

- 1. Immediate eggs
- 2. Less equipment needed

Cons

- 1. Sickness can more easily be brought into your flock
- 2. More front expense

 - 1. Desired Egg color
 - 2. Cold/Heat tolerance
 - 3. Aesthetic appeal
 - 4. Egg laying capabilities

Things to keep in mind while building


- Keep it as light weight and low as possible







Why Electric Netting?


- Its easily movable

- Much less expensive than permanent fencing























Chicken Health
